He also has received his OSHA 10 certification and first aid and CPR training. Presently, he is enrolled in the school's cooperative

education program working at a Whirlpool warehouse in the area.

As a student at Northern York High School, Noah learned a variety of skills including how to get and keep a job; and how to live on his own including paying bills, finding a place to live, and buying a vehicle. In the past year, Noah has successfully obtained his driver's license. This has opened the door for employment at Wendy's where he is seen as a good employee and a valuable member of the work crew.
